PRIEST: Let us turn to God our Father with confidence, trusting in his mercy and love, as we bring our prayers before him.

May the innocent victims of fighting in Gaza, Ukraine and Sudan discover security, healing and hope. We pray that the current peace talks will bring lasting peace in the Middle East. (Pause) Lord hear us. Response: Lord graciously hear us.

READER: We pray especially this weekend for the work of PACT the national Catholic charity which supports prisoners, their families and offers prisoners a chance to turn their lives around.

May all prisoners be aware of your presence with them and may your spirit bring them peace and the hope of new life in Jesus Christ. (Pause) Lord hear us. Response: Lord graciously hear us.

READER: We pray in thankfulness for God's many gifts. May we always recognise his grace and mercy in our lives (Pause) Lord hear us. Response Lord graciously hear us.

READER: We pray for those who care for the sick, the elderly, or the marginalised. May God strengthen and reward caregivers, volunteers, and health-workers for their compassion, patience, and humility (Pause) Lord hear us. Response: Lord graciously hear us.

READER: We pray that those touched by shadows of bereavement, may feel themselves close to their dear ones, through him whose light even death could not overcome.
