World Day of the Poor Sunday 17th November

'The hope of the poor shall not perish for ever'

In his message for the third World Day of the Poor, celebrated on 17 November 2019, Pope Francis reminds us that "the poor are not numbers, but people", to be assisted, accompanied, protected, defended and saved. He recalled that this is not possible without the humility of listening, the charism of the whole, the courage of renunciation. He reminded us that to "follow the way of charity, of humility and of listening means lending an ear to the little ones", because God reveals himself through them.
