PRIEST: God of Life, in today's Gospel we hear that we cannot serve both you and wealth. So, we come to you seeking courage and resolve to follow you more closely, even when it involves making personal sacrifices.

READER: We pray for Pope Leo, as he takes a stance on economic divisions in our world. May we follow his example of compassionate concern and stand up for justice and fairness.

READER: We pray for those caught up in conflict and war, and we pray for peace in the wider world. May the hearts of the warmongers be changed and become filled with compassion and the love of God.

(Pause) Lord hear us. Response Lord graciously hear us.

READER: We pray for the work of Catholic Evangelisation, in which we all have a role, in sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with others. Equip us to be messengers of your Word; may we never shy away from opportunities to tell others about you.

(Pause) Lord hear us. Response: Lord graciously hear us.

READER: We pray that those touched by shadows of bereavement, may feel themselves close to their dear ones, through him whose light even death could not overcome.
